1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Samaguri College, affiliated to Gauhati University, established on the 1st day of March, 1990, Provincialized on 1st January, 2013 and included in 2(f) 12(b) under UGC Act in November, 2013, is one of the premier higher educational institutions of Nagaon district, Assam. It is the only higher educational institution in Samaguri Legislative Constituency and it is 20 km away from Nagaon Town.

Established in the green, peaceful and pleasing atmosphere on north bank of the river Kolong by a group of educationists and social workers of greater Samaguri area to provide higher education to the youth and thereby to enlighten the socio-economic horizon of the area. To touch the goal of quality education, the college, from its inception, has not only been trying to make every possible effort to develop the hidden potentials of the youth, but also trying its level best to mould them as successful and responsible citizen of the nation.

Samaguri College offers Three Years Degree Course (BA) in Semester system in Arts Stream. The college offers both Honours Course (HC) and Regular Course (RC) at undergraduate level under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). At present, the overall curriculum of the college includes honours in eight optional subjects along with the compulsory subjects. From this session, in addition to already running Prana-Ayam (Yoga); Lingua –Franca(Spoken English), another three new self financed certificate courses of three months duration, namely Kushilava(Drama); Pokha (Nursery); and Smart Gen(Computer literacy) are going to be introduced and preparation for that is going on. The college has been adopting various plan and activities to ensure all-round development of the students.

Besides the central library with a balanced collection of text books, reference books, journals and periodicals, news papers each department has its departmental library to cater the need of the students and teachers.

The well- experienced faculty members of the college try their best to provide all possible help to the students by teaching, guiding and mentoring. The uniqueness of Samaguri college team is that they always dedicate themselves to ensure value based quality education and engage to fulfill the dreams of the founders of Samaguri Mahavidyalaya.

To ensure quality higher education for all and promote equity, inclusion and harmony in order to achieve need based, time relevant learning outcome to cope- up with the emerging changes of the society.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

- 1. Experienced, dynamic and committed faculty.
- 2. Continuous update of teachers through refresher courses and faculty development programs.
- 3. Well-planned curriculum and co-curricular activities.
- 4. Student centric education.
- 5. Community participation.
- 6. Healthy interaction between teachers and students which go beyond class room.
- 7. Clean, green and large campus area having scope of infrastructure expansion.
- 8. Locational advantage i.e. near the national highway and in a peaceful rural setup.

Institutional Weakness

- 1. The college suffers from unavailability of funds to develop the infrastructure of the college and to expand the developmental work.
- 2. The parents and guardians are financially weak, so they are reluctant of providing their wards with proper education. Inclination to higher education is low as parents couldnot afford.
- 3. Some of the students have to earn during the learning period.
- 4. The college was provincialized in 2013 after 23 years of its establishment, so the staffs had to serve the institution with a minimum amount of remuneration for a long period. Some of the employees have not been getting government salary till date.
- 5. Less number of PhD qualified faculty and lack of major/minor research projects.

Institutional Opportunity

1. The college has a large land area within the campus and in future there is a scope for infrastructure expansion needed for its development.

2. The college has an experienced and dedicated team of faculties. therefore with the proper development of infrastructure, it will be possible to introduce various time relevent courses on demand.

3. The college is situated in a suitable location for study having good transport and communication facility that further development in the infrastructure will ensure the increase of student strength.

4. As most of the students come from agri-based rural society, courses on organic farming, aquaculture and ecotourism etc. may be introduced for them with the availability of fund.

Institutional Challenge

1. Most of the students of the college are first generation learners.

- 2. The college has the challenge of increasing the enrolment of the students and minimizing the rate of drop out students.
- 3. Poor educational and economic background of the students affects the psychology and often cannot concentrate in studies.
- 4. Guardians are not conscious about their wards so, it is hard to obtain proper feedback from them.
- 5. The College has the challenge of increasing numbers of research and extension activities.
- 6. The teachers are often engaged in government duties like Census, NRC, Election, Gunotsav etc. which hamper the regular classes.
- 7. Some of the faculties do not get government salary. So, sometime they lose enthusiasm to perform their duty cheerfully.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Curriculum Planning and Implementation-Curriculum is the essential part of any education system regardless of the education level. Samaguri College is affiliated to Gauhati University scrupulously follows the curriculum prescribed by the University. The college follow the academic calendar, the course design and development programme of affiliated University. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) has been introduced in all programs since academic session 2019 as per the scheme of Gauhati University. The college is offering UG Arts program in subjects with honours follows the CBCS curriculum from 2019.

Samaguri College has a systematic mechanism for analyzing the objectives of the curriculum. The College prospectus is published with all necessary information about the college. The academic session of the college starts with student induction programme 'Vidyarambh'. Keeping in mind the all round development of the students, the IQAC of Samaguri College prepares a calendar incorporating academic and co-curricular activities on the basis of Academic calendar of the affiliated University in convenience of the institution.

For effective delivery of the curriculum the IQAC and Academic committee prepare a planned class routine by consulting all the HoDs of the departments. Each department again rearrange the class routine with remedial classes and equal distribution of classes among the faculty according to their work -load.

The college provides opportunities for better exposure to the students by conducting field trips, project work and outdoor activities for students. The college faculty members always engage the students in various activities and conduct different expert lectures. A healthy and friendly environment has been maintained for the students and working members of the college.

The college also focuses on other curricular aspects like Gender sensitization, environmental issues, moral and ethical values, and so on. These issues are dealt with community orientation programs. Structured feedbacks are also collected from all stakeholders of the college and necessary initiatives are undertaken.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

Samaguri College issues prospectus mentioning the existing courses, rule regulation and necessary information about the college. The admission process of the college is transparent and follows the rule of the Assam Government. This process begins from the orientation of the fresher's through induction programmes.

Direct classroom teaching is carried out as per the prescribed mode and syllabus of the affiliating university. The HEI follows academic calendar of the affiliating university. The college follows a semester system where internal evaluation is a continuous and comprehensive process. Teachers use student-centric methods, such as experiential learning (practical), participative learning, problem solving, lecture cum discussion, assignments etc. Classes are taken according to the class routine prepared by Academic committee and IQAC. The College has systematic mentoring system. Teachers mentor the students from their own departments. Each teacher mentors 15 to 20 students. Teachers mentor the attendance, academic performance and participation in other co curricular and extracurricular activities of the mentees. The teachers continuously update themselves with new methodologies by joining the FDP, Orientation Programme, Refresher Course, Seminar; Workshop etc.. Teachers use participatory methods and make the classes student friendly. The College organizes interdisciplinary talks with eminent persons for the benefit of the students. As a part of continuous formative assessment each faculty member supervises project works, assignment and viva test for their concerned subjects to evaluate the students. Internal and external examinations are evaluated by faculty members and recorded the academic performance. Students are taken to the places of curriculum importance for field study. In order to inculcate the social values among the students different community awareness programmes are arranged on the issues of environment, gender sensitization, pandemic, road safety etc. Students are felicitated for their performance in other student centric activities. Some special programmes are also arranged for slow learners and advance learners. The College library is enhanced with text books, reference books, journals, periodicals, magazines and news paper. Besides college library each department has departmental library from where students and faculty can borrow books. The IQAC and academic committee evaluate the teaching learning process quarterly. Samaguri College collects feedback from different stakeholders like students, parents, alumni and there by tries to improve the institution.

Research, Innovations and Extension

As a newly provincialized college, the institution is currently offering under graduate courses in arts stream only. Therefore, the research is limited. However, the college encourages research activities of both the faculty members and students. The college encourages the teachers to undertake research projects, both minor and major, to enhance the quality of education. Some of the teachers have done research works for their M.Phil and Ph.D, while many are aspiring to do Ph.Ds. In order to encourage and familiarize research to both students and teachers, the institution highly encourages participation in seminars, workshops, symposium etc. students are acquainted with research related activities through field study, survey, project that are undertaken at regular interval of time. Keeping in mind the importance of research, some of our teachers have been publishing research articles in various journals including UGC recognized research journals. The institution has Research Cell constituted by efficient faculties who are themselves well versed in the arena of research.

There are five (5) books published by the publication cell and different departments of the institution. These publications include articles and research papers on diverse field of study. In order to enhance research activities the College has signed several numbers of Memorandum of Understanding with different institutions like Mahapurush Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya, Nagaon, B.K.B. College, Nonoi College etc.

The teachers of Samaguri College always share their knowledge on various innovative and valuable issues. Awareness Programmes on Health Insurance, Vigilance Awareness, Digitalization of transaction, Digital India Awareness Camp, Blood Donation Awareness Camp, Celebration of World Environment day etc. are some programmes organized to make aware and motivate the students to establish a healthy society. The extension programmes are also a part of creating inclination, cognizance and realization for a safe and healthy society. Samaguri College has signed numbers of MoUs with NGOs to boost extension activities. During Covid-19 pandemic, the college was converted into Covid care centre and the teachers performed their duties as supervisors. The college has adopted a village where various awareness campaigns on social and economic issues are organized.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Proper infrastructure is an important requirement for quality teaching-learning outcome. Samaguri College has a campus of 10 bigha, 2 katha, and 2.58 lecha. The total build up area is 4098.40 sq.mt. Infrastructural development is in progress from the time of its inception under different government schemes and community support. Keeping pace with modern education system the college has a smart classroom and Wi-Fi facility in the campus. The classrooms of the college are optimally used by all the departments. The ICT enabled classroom is used by all departments. A well furnished staff room is there for the faculty. The institution has installed closed circuit cameras at various strategic locations of the college in order to ensure a secure environment. Clean drinking water facilities, canteen, multipurpose Hall cum auditorium, etc., are also available for the students and teachers. Geography and Education department have laboratory with equipment. There is a hostel for girl students. There are separate common rooms for boys and girls with adequate toilet facilities. The girl common room has an incinerator for disposal of sanitary pads.

Samaguri College has Lt. Phulmai Bora Memorial library donated by a social activists Mr. Dilip Kr. Bora in the name of his mother in the year 2018. The library has text books and reference books (approximately 5000 nos.). Besides, there are News papers, Periodicals, Research journals etc. The library is operating through ILMS.

The institution encourages games and sports. There is a playground in the college campus. Sports equipments are upkept by games and sports cell and students union.

Student Support and Progression

Samaguri College tries to ensure all round development of the students. There are regular students mentoring system in the college. Students are mentored by the teachers from their own department. During pandemic teachers mentored the physical and mental health of student in online mode. Students of Samaguri College receive the government benefits of Fee Waiver Scheme. They also get scholarship from state and central government. The ST/SC/OBC/ and Minority Cell makes the students from these categories aware about different facilities reserved for them. Personality development programmes are organized by this cell. Extension and outreach programmes are arranged to develop social responsibility of the students. The College has Anti-ragging Cell, Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti Sexual Harassment Cell for the welfare of the students. There is a cultural cell that organizes different cultural events. There is provision in the departmental class routine for remedial classes for slow learners. In order to enhance readability among students the college routine has library class. The total 78.82% students have been benefited getting free ships and 24.62% students benefited getting scholarship from the session 2017-18 to 2021-22. The College has been providing award in the name of Mahendra Nath Das to the proficient student securing the highest marks in the end semester examination from 2016 onwards. This award is sponsored by the family of late Mahendra Nath Das.

Samaguri College encourages students participation in games and sports. Students of this college participate

in various inter district and inter college sports competitions. The students and alumni of Samaguri College participated in the national hockey and football tournament and also won medals. Besides, students also take part in other co curricular activities like essay, quiz, poem writing, cultural Rally competition etc... Recently students from Economics department won first prize in inter district easy competition.

Pass out students from Samaguri College got admitted in different Universities for post graduation. Considerable number of students have got jobs in government and private sectors. communication with passed out students remains through alumni association of the college.

Governance, Leadership and Management

Samaguri College believes in achieving the goal through team work. For effective decision making, evolving policy and strategies the college supports decentralized and participatory management system. The working culture functions in hierarchy. It comprises the teaching staff, non-teaching staff, the student union, the governing body with the principal who is the main string of connection among all of these. The Governing Body appoints the Principal on the recommendation of the Selection Committee which is duly formed under university norms and entrusts the Principal to discharge the duties as the Head of the Institution. The Principal is assisted by the Vice-Principal, HoDs, and other Teaching and Non-Teaching staff. The administrative structure of the college is simple and all the heads are given due responsibilities to avoid any lapses of duties. The IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell) is also an important unit that has been formed to assist and execute administrative and academic role for the overall functioning of the college in determining quality education. To look after the various matters pertaining to academic, administrative and infrastructure issues various committees are formed such as Academic committee, building committee, purchase committee, examination committee, research cell, hostel management cell, cultural and literacy cell etc. besides mandatory committees like Anti-ragging committee, Anti-sexual harassment cell, Grievance redressed cell etc. Samaguri College maintains transparency in admission procedure. For financial transparency the college uses cashless transaction. College maintains different accounts for different funds like general fund, games and sports fund, examination fund etc. College activities are well published in college public domain.

The welfare measures for faculty and students are governed by the rules of State government and Department of Higher Education, Assam. Faculty members are also encouraged to participate in various career advancement programmers for their career advancement.

At present the college conducts yearly audit by certified chartered accountant. The college receives financial assistance from state government and from kind hearted people in cash and kind.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The institution is very determined in upholding its moral principles and values. As such, besides academics, the college tries to instill moral, ethical and social values in students. The institution puts emphasis and effort in inculcating the basic human values and respect for the environment. The college firmly believes that community service is a noble service towards humanity. Several activities such as cleanliness, plantation and awareness campaigns on social issues are conducted for the benefit of society and at the same time, teaching the importance of doing such things to students. Promoting Environmental consciousness, gender equality, social responsibility among the faculties and students are also the Best Practices of the Institution. The code of conduct of the college are published in prospectus, mentor books as well as in college website.

Approachability and accessibility between students and teachers are encouraged for building better relations towards realizing the vision and mission of the college.

One distinctiveness of the institution is the greater numbers of girl students than the boy students. The college is located in a rural area and most of the students are from conservative families belonging to minority and tribal communities. The uniqueness of the college is that in every academic session there are 20 to 25% married girls pursue the higher education from this institution.

Institutional preparedness for NEP

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary: <	Samaguri College is a pure Arts College having subjects of Humanities and Social Science streams. Geography, a science-based subject has been included in the institution from its inception. As, in practice, Arts and science are not foes, but friends and both are exist harmoniously by cooperating each other to touch the common goal for a better World. As inclusion of holistic multidisciplinary courses is a must for touching the goal for better world, the college has made approach for introduction of such courses. The institution is planning for introduction of subjects from science and commerce streams. It is expected that the subjects will be introduced soon. Samaguri College follows the Syllabus designed by the affiliated university. In 2019 Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced. Besides, classes are also arranged for topics that are not present in the syllabus but very much required. Projects, Field Trips, Community Service, programme on environmental issues, gender are arranged to supplement the syllabus. Topics are decided by the current and future socio-economic needs. Samaguri College is going to introduced three new add on courses, including vocational course like Nursery training, Computer Literacy Course which can make the students self dependent. The proposal for new add on courses send to Gauhati University for necessary academic approval. College academic calendar arrange programme which will help the students to link the learning to real life situation and solve problems, tries to develop the sense of social responsibility. In order to find solution to society's most buring issues and challenges the college has signed a memorandum of understanding with Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankaradeva Viswavidyalaya to undertake research mutually to solve local social problem. The college has planned to introduce science, commerce and all subjects of humanities and vocational course. It also tries to make aware the students the emerging issues and challenges faced by the society so that they can contribu
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	Academic Bank Credits is an innovative measure of NEP-2020 to earn and deposit credits. This is a
	student's centric system and can bring uniformity. Extra credit can be earned by students through SWAYAM, NPTEL, V-Lab and such other schemes.

	Students can continue his/her studies if he/she has to drop one or two years due to harsh situation. Samaguri College is affiliated to Gauhati University; in this regard the College will follow the instruction of the affiliated University. However the College has been making the students aware about Academic Bank Credit.
3. Skill development:	The Syllabus of Samaguri College is designed by affiliated University. Certificate courses in Spoken English was introduced for two session and life skill "Yoga" has been introduced for a sessions. From the session 2022-23 three more add on course on Nursery, Drama and Computer literacy are going to be introduced. Nursery training course and Computer literacy programme are two vocational courses which are suitable for the students of the College. For this the course structures are prepared by the coordinators and send to the affiliated university for approval and permission. It has planned to incorporate more vocational courses in every academic year according to the need of time and situation and going to be made compulsory for every student that at least they learn one vocation when they complete their undergraduate course. Since many of the students earn while studying, they are partly engage in farming, the College arranges training on organic agriculture which is convenient to socio economic background of this area. The institution arranges counseling, workshop, training on organic agriculture, tourism and hospitality. The college students belong to different linguistic groups like Bodo, Rabha, Munda, Orang, Santhal, Assamese, karbi etc. College publishes magazine where students can write their article in their own languages and display their creative talent. Samaguri College has language box to preserve the endangered language. Samaguri College tries to develop the feeling of belongingness towards Indian culture among the students. Local fairs and festivals are celebrated in College with great pomp and grandeur. College organizes cultural rally, arranges competition on traditional food and costume. it is tried to make the college environment like an ashrama. The College arranges different programmes to develop the sense of appreciation towards Indian Culture and Tradition. Local festivals as well as national and international commemorative days are celebrated. Extempore speech, quiz, essay competitions are held on special occasion. Students are given projects, taken to field trips to the places of historical interest. Samaguri College is located in rural areas, students from marginal community comes to College. As the students belong to the economically poor section they cannot afford a laptop or desktop so they used android mobile to attend classes. Now classes are going on in offline mode teacher use technology for reinforcement in teaching. College premises have Wi-Fi facility. Classes are taken in digital classroom. Students are suggested online links to explore more to the content of the lesson.

2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences using ICT tools

Response:

There are three vital components in teaching-learning process. Teacher plays an important role in teaching process. Learning depends on students activities, attitude, interest, attention and motivation. Environment plays another role in teaching-learning process where syllabus and students motto is the main effective factors.

In the beginning of the session each department holds a departmental meeting and prepared an academic plan on the basis of discussion among the faculty members of the respective departments for whole session for smooth transaction of the curriculum. The course contents are distributed among the faculty members keeping in mind their expertise so that each teacher can give their best while enjoying their teaching. The lesson plans are prepared by individual teachers for their allotted courses. Academic aspects are maintained by the Vice-Principal with a daily class routine. In the class routine emphasis is given on advance and slow learners by introducing remedial classes and classes on demand by students.

Use of TLM for better teaching learning process is highly encouraged and followed by the faculty members. Audio-visual materials are being used in the digital classrooms. Each department uses TLM and their creative materials for knowledge catering. Teachers use student centric method such as experiential, participatory, problem solving for curriculum delivery. For better understanding of assigned topics, demonstration method, lecture method, discussion methods, explain and used questionnaire for the students. Question answer sessions and group discussion are also arranged to measure the level of understanding and expression of the delivered course.

Projects on various topics **are assigned to the students so that they can learn how to collect data from the field and then data analysis for report preparation.**

There are more than 5000 Text and reference books along with journals, magazines **and periodicals in the central library of the college.**

Departments organize conduct competitions like quiz, essay writing, pem recitation extension work, cultural activities etc.. Besides, the college also arrange programmes on awareness on social issues like gender, environmental awareness, sustainability, hazards, physical and mental health, digital platform,E-resource, E-learning. **Students are guided by the mentor- mentee system**. 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

The new session starts in August. The merit list for the admission is notified on the college website and college notice board. Student's induction programme "*Vidyarambha*" is arranged before the beginning of the classes. In the Academic Calendar, the date of admission, Induction program, Freshman Social, Divas, Social Activities, Sessional examination and all holidays are included.

Sessional examinations are conducted according to the guidelines of the affiliated University. The academic committee prepares a routine for the sessional examination and is notified in the notice board. Departments set questions and conducts examination. Sessional marks counted along with the assignment and percentage of attendance of the students. Department conduct repeats sessional examination for the absentee students. Sessional marks are displayed in the notice board and also kept recorded by the department. If any grievances arise regarding the examination then it is redressed by the department itself.

End semester examinations are conducted according to the guideline of the affiliated University. The affiliated University circulates the examination routine and accordingly exams are held. Routines are notified on college website and college notice board and circulated in the student's Whatsapp group. There is a strong examination centre committee to conduct the final examination. Local SDC is the chairman and principal is the O.C (Officer-in-charge) of examination and members are selected according to UGC guideline. An AOC (Assistant Officer-in-charge) is appointed to carry out the end semester examination at college. As per guidelines of the affiliating University in B.A. (1+1+1) semester system 20 marks is given to the students from internal assessment and at the end semester they write for 80 marks. In CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) syllabus, the internal marks are divided into three categories, such as– Sessional examination, Home assignment and Class attendance. For maintaining transparency in the evaluation mechanism of the internal examinations, the marks obtained by the students are displayed in the notice boards. The students those who score less mark in the sessional examination are guided by the department teachers. If any grievances arise it is discussed at appropriate level and sorted out immediately.

The institution has a single stream (Arts stream) with 9 numbers of departments. The college building is consists of one Principal's Chamber, one IQAC Room, Two Numbers of Digital Class Rooms, one Teachers Common room, one girl's common room, one boy's common room, and two numbers of Office Rooms with attached toilet and One Girls Hostel with a capacity of 16 borders. The central library of Samaguri college library is known as Phul Mai Borah Memorial Library. It is a separate building constructed in 2017. The library has an automation system with library software named ANYDESK. There are more than 5000 books in the Samaguri College library. From 2017 to 2022, 938 numbers of books has been purchased with the expense of Rs. 246885. It should also be mentioned here that 936 numbers of books has been donated by the students and well wisher of college during the same period. There are total 8 numbers of journals; one regional language news paper and one international language news paper, eight numbers of periodicals are subscribed. The library is well equipped reading facilities with separate section both for the teachers and the students. The library maintains daily user register both for the teachers and for the students separately. The library has a separate committee for the improvement of library, its infrastructure and academic resources. All important decisions of the library are taken by the committee and the secretary is vested to take the follow up action on matters relating to purchase of books, journals, periodicals, maintenance of discipline, safety of books etc.

Academic Development : Under the initiative of the principal along with the support of IQAC and approval from the GB, five different departments of the college are going to introduce five Add - On certificate courses on Yoga, Drama, Spoken English, Computer Literacy and Nursery. For that files have been submitted to GU for approval. Numbers of MoUs have been signed by the college IQAC with different institutions to ensure its ceaseless progress in this area.

To meet up the growing demand for a separate and big library the administration of the college searched for benevolent donors . Accordingly Mr. Dilip Kumar Borah retired. DGP,DGCD & CGHG, and a noted litterateur of Assam donated the present library building in memory of his mother . He has now also provided the college with Rs. 40,000/= to buy the software needed for library automation .

Samaguri College formulates strategic plans for the all round development of the institution and works in accordance with these. The college involves all stakeholders. The functions of the institution's academic and administrative units are governed by the principles of participation and transparency. Gauhati University also helps in maintaining quality and achieving its goal . The IQAC , with the help of teaching and non-teaching staff , students and alumni and other stakeholders of the institute reviewed and revised the quality policy. The college also follows policy adopted by the State Government.

Samaguri College was established by some educationists and generous people in 1990 to meet the need of higher education of the youths of Samaguri Legislative Constituency and to bring transformation in the society around. Since then the Governing Body, principal & non-teaching staff and faculty members have been developing and implementing quality policy. The college is governed by the Department of Higher Education, Govt.of Assam, its parent University (Gauhati University) and the college GB. 6.3 Faculty Empowerment Strategies

6.3.1 The institution has effective welfare measures and Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff

Response:

There are set rules and procedures as a part of welfare measures to all the government employees in the department of higher education. The same rules are applicable to our college employees. The list of such welfare measures are as follows :

The teachers who want to pursue their Ph.D are also encouraged by providing educational leave .

7. Health services : The college has first aid health services available to meet emergency medical situations . Free health check up camp and Health awareness programmes are conducted to make employees aware of different health issues .

The college follows the Performance Based Appraisal System prescribed by UGC . The parent university has developed an Academic Performance Indicator (API) system which is based on PBAS. The IQAC of the college deals with all the matters related to the performance based appraisal system of the staff and regularly evaluates it and forwards it to the DHE and University for final validation of API scores . These scores are compiled and presented to the university authority under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS).

Response:

Yes, the institution conducts external financial audits regularly. The external audit is done by a competent Chartered Accountant firm namely Preeti Agarwal & Associates. Annual salary and non-salary audit is conducted by the Joint Director, verified and approved by the Senior Auditor of Higher Education and finally by the Accountant General (AG).

It has strategies for mobilisation and optimal utilisation of resources and funds from various sources . The institution communicates its needs and requirements to the society, government and sometimes too well-todo individuals and philanthropists and mainly to the Government of Assam and after provincialisation to the UGC also . The employees of the college also share their contribution for the development of their institution . The Governing Body and the college administration along with IQAC try their best to get grants under different schemes and use it to the optimum. The college library , the new building with smart classrooms and the girls' hostel are some examples of the college's venture to get donations from philanthropists and grants from Assam Government and UGC. The UGC grants are utilised as per UGC guidelines and government grants are utilised as per government guidelines .

Mobilisation of financial resources is done to a greater extent through fees collected under various heads from students such as admission fees, examination fees, tuition fees, enrolment fees, games & sports fees, magazine fees, student welfare fund fees, festival fees etc. The college follows rules and regulations of the government and university regarding its fee structure. Fee collected from students is accumulated in

general fund accounts and utilised as per requirement of the college .

6.5 Internal Quality Assurance System

6.5.1 Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes. It reviews teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals and records the incremental improvement in various activities

Yes, IQAC of the college has been playing a significant role in institutionalising the quality assurance strategies and process. Since its inception,IQAC has been working for the conscious,

consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the college through involving various departments, committees and cells of the college. IQAC conducts regular meetings with all the HoDs and aims at monitoring teaching learning processes. IQAC provides acdemic diary to each department to have information of the day to day activities of all teachers . Initiative of the IQAC made it possible for the college to have punching machines and CCTV inside the campus for monitoring. In the field of research and extension it has been continuously encouraging the faculties to contribute their articles and research papers in various books and journals. The college has published four nos.of ISBN knowledge based article volumes from 2017 to 2021. Another volume is going to be published within December 2022. Almost all the faculty members contribute their articles and research papers in these volumes . Teachers of the college have published more than 86 research articles and research papers in different ISBN books and proceedings of state level, national and international seminars. All total 07 no. of research papers have been published in the peer reviewed UGC care listed journals. Some of them contributed chapters to different books . Moreover, IQAC itself in collaboration with different institutions has been organising workshops, seminars and different awareness camps for all round development of different stakeholders of this institution . Moreover the departments and the cells are provided with support to organise different programmes. In fact IQAC is the life force of the college.

Response:

Samaguri College is a co educational college, dedicated to establish gender equality in the College as well as in the society. A session on gender sensitization is always there in the student induction programme for the new students. The College organizes different programmes on gender sensitization in time to time. Samaguri College has a women Cell which is established with the mission to sensitize to gender discrimination, to abolish any kind of bias exist in society and to assist women in overcoming challenges to attain fullness. Every year International Women's Day is observed highlighting the themes like "Overcoming Challenges toward Fullness", "Gender Equality for Sustainable Tomorrow". Eminent personalities who work in this field are invited to deliver speechs. Besides Women Cell there is a Grievance Redressal Cell to deal with any type of grievances, Anti-sexual Harassment Cell which has systematic mechanism to deal with types of complains. Counseling Cell provides psychological counseling to the students of the college. These cells arrange programme on gender sensitization, women empowerment and awareness on gender equality.

To promote gender equity the institution enures safety of the students specially of the female by building concrete boundary wall with gate. Visitors are properly scrutinized. Wearing of full uniform with identity card are compulsory for students. The college campus is under CCTV surveillance. There is separate common room for boys and girls with toilet facilities. Incinerator is installed in girl's toilet. There is well structured mentoring system in the institution. In the college union body one seat is reserved for girl student. Gender equality is reflected in policy making process of the college. The vice principal, IQAC coordinator, and at various committee level gender equality is maintained.

Samaguri College takes every initiative in inculcating the spirit of integrity, unity, brotherhood and nationalism. Independence Day, Republic Day, Gandhi Jayanti are celebrated with great enthusiasm at the College. On these occasions, National Flag is hoisted, speech is delivered by eminent person on the spirit of freedom movement and martyrs are remembered with respect and honour. Samaguri College has prospective annual academic and co curricular activity plan. Every department and cells are given the oppurtunity to observe specific national and international commemorative days, events and festivals. Some of the days and activities that are organized every years are as follows-

- 1.15th August Independence Day is celebrated by hoisting National Flag. Speech is delivered by eminent person.
- 2. Gandhi Jayanti is celebrated by Political Science and History Department. Workshop and seminar are organized.
- 3. Teacher's Day is celebrated by teacher's unit laying emphasis on Radha Krishnan's philosophy. Speech by teachers and students are delivered.
- 4.On 31st October national Unity day is observed by political Science department. Extempore speech, quiz, singing competition are conducted.
- 5. On 26th November Constitution Day is observed. Quiz, essay competition are arranged.

- 6.25th January Voters Day is celebrated by arranging awareness programme.
- 7.26th January Republic day is celebrated by hoisting National Flag.
- 8. International Women's Day is celebrated by women cell. Arrange programme on gender awareness.

Samaguri College tries to establish inclusive environment where students belonging to different cultural, religious, linguistic background can freely express their own opinions, views, fully participate in all activities and feel safe. The college acts in accordance the set of rules which are framed on the basis of our constitution. These include socialism, secularism, democracy, equality, justice, human dignity and unity. Unity in diversity is the pride of India. The codes of conducts of the teachers, students, employees are published on the website of the college.For easy access of the students, the student's codes of conduct are published in the mentoring books. Each department sensitizes students to maintain harmony in college

level as well as in the society. The college observes days of national and international importance like Independence Day, Republic Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Constitutional Day, International Women's Day, world Environment Day, Ekta Divas to inculcate the value of non-violence, integrity, unity, brotherhood, human value.Essay competition, extempore speech competition, quiz competition are arranged to help the students to explore the Indian constitution and Indian democratic system. On special Occasions eminent personalities who have contribution in different social field are invited to deliver lecture and motivate the students. College organizes leadership training for the students. Cultural rally, traditional dress competition, folk song and folk dance competition, traditional dish competition are arranged in annual college week to make the students appreciate the rich cultural heritage of the society.

The College has Prospective Annual Academic and Co-Curricular Activities Plan. Accordingly each department and cells have specific days to observe and activities to undertake. This calendar includes national and international days of importance and some other diwas. On 2nd December National Pollution Day is observed by awareness programme, National Energy Conservation Day is observed by Geography and Extension Cell, awareness programme is organized by women Cell and Counseling Committee on 24th January, on National Girl's Child Day, on 20th February World Day of Social Justice is observed by Economics and Education Department. On 7th April World Health Day is observed by English and Geography departments. Assamese and Hindi Department celebrate World Heritage Day on 18th April. On 15th May International Day of Family is observed. Programme on 21st May that is on International Anti-Terrorism Dayis organized by History and Education Departments. Rabha Divas, Birth and death anniversary of Bharat Ratna awarded Dr Bhupen Hazarika, International Mother Language Day, international Yoga day, National Unity Divas, Voters Awareness Day, Lachit Divas are celebrated in the college to develop the feeling of togetherness among the students.

Samaguri College has NSS unit, Red Ribbon Club, Extension Cell which undertake extension and outreach programme to make aware the students of the different social issues.

Flood relief, plantation programme, swacch abhijan, cashless transaction, blood donation, women empowerment programme, environmental awareness programme are arranged to create social responsibility among the students. Besides these the committees like Anti- Ragging Committee, Grievance Redressed Cell, Counseling Cell, and Cultural Literary Cell sensitize students about maintaining of inclusive environment and highlighting the importance of harmony towards cultural, linguistic, communal, socio-economic and other diversity.

Response:

1. Title of the Practice: Green Initiative

2. Objectives of the Practice ----

The objectives of the practice for clean and green environment are as follows:

- To develop a clean and green surrounding
- To make aware the young generation for sustainable development
- To protect the surrounding from environmental degradation

3. The Context:

To maintain and develop an eco-friendly environment in the college campus, effort has been put with our neighbour & students. Various types of indigenous, medicinal and local varieties of plants were planted.

The college has been trying its best to make the campus green. As various types of trees are planted in teh campus and it attracts different types of birds for nesting. Making a place eco-friendly and suitable for birds, animal, reptiles, butterflies and other species is a continuous process which needs sincerity and hard work. The college takes initiative in planting in the adopted villages and other places and around the institution.

4. The Practice—

Plant saplings were collected form various sources and alongwith distribution, plantation programmes are undertaken. Proper nursing of the planted saplings are given. Plants are selected on the basis of site suitability. Fruit bearing trees are planted as they ultimately become nesting and roosting places for birds and other animals. Shady trees are planted in the campus to keep the atmosphere cool in summer months. Three gardens for seasonal flowers are also there in the campus.

Single use plastic items such as disposable plastic cup and glasees etc. are strictly baned in the campus. The canteen authority is also instructed not to use any such items. Garbage disposal is mainteded scientifically. Besides regular awarness and plantation programmes, during lockdown period, online activities included plantion programme where students planted saplings in their home and share photos.

5. Evidence of Success----

The effort of making the college campus beautiful and green can be seen at the first sight. The existence of ficus trees, bushes and surrounded green villages around provide a favorable atmosphere for different types of birds and endanger species to take shelter in the area.

We have found a yellow footed green pigeon behind a tree inside our college campus. We have planted some local variety trees like ficus, shilikha or haritaki, arjun, olive, amla etc. It attracts variety of birds into our college campus. A wounded yellow footed green pigeon was rescued within the campus and has been nursing in captive mood, as the bird was unable to fly and it was separated from the flock.

The age old "**Ficus**" tree (*ficus religiosa*) within the college campus has been providing shelter to many birds, snakes and "Gecko". The old ficus tree is now turned into a "habitat" of the Tokay Gecko which is enlisted in **ICUN 3.1 - Least Concern**. The nocturnal lizard is now available in the Samaguri College campus and its surroundings which presence is felt by its loud call mainly during its mating season. A gecko was rescued from the college library with the help of an environmental activist and handed it over to Salona forest range office.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required -

(i) It is very difficult for the college to maintain and preserve the eco-friendly environment as it needs utmost care and attention from all the members of the institution and the neighboring people.

(ii) We urgently need an extra fund to maintain and continue with our practices.

We should always protect our environment as the earth exists not only for mankind but also for all creatures of the world.

We have been performing various activities for the community, such as blood donation camp (2017), Swasha Bharat Abhijan (2018), Road Safety awareness campaign, Xasaj Voter's Divas (2019), Distribution of hand sanitizer on Covid-19 pandemic, managerial assistance and support to the villages and farmers, farmers awareness program etc. Such activities provide proper guidance and information among the common people of the society.

Our continuous effort to help, interact and guide our neighbouring society is more or less effective as we realize.

Existing banana garden near our college is a result of our initiative and assistance. We regularly visit the garden and consult with the farmer and "*Gram Sevak*" for the development of such agricultural

activities.

Sometimes, we send our college students to agricultural nurseries for training propose. After visiting these nurseries they become more enthusiastic for nursery business. It will certainly benefit them to attain self sufficiency.

During the time of Covid-19 pandemic, we make our nearby villagers aware and distributing hand sanitizers and free mask.

The adopted village is now more at touch with the college and the villagers are now very happy with the cooperation aiming to uplift their all round well-being.

7.3 Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 1000 words

Response:

Samaguri College is the only institution of higher education in the Samaguri Constituency, located in the rural area dominated by minority and tribal population has been contributing to the academic and social sphere of Samaguri area including the parts of Nagaon district and boarder area of Karbi Anglong district. It has been dedicated to the vision of the institution that making higher education accessible to all aspirant. The College gives admission to all students regardless of their pass percentage in class 12. The students who have scored 30 to 40 percentages get admission and equally mentored, treated well and completed their graduation with good percentage. If the institution was not there many would not have the opportunity to pursue higher education. Most of them are from backward community such as Bodo, karbi, Rabha, Munda, Orang, Santhal, Bhumij, Ahom, Koch, and minority etc. The institution is co-education, encourage education for all. Both boys and girls are given equal opportunities in all activities of the institutions. Students are benefited by government schemes like free waiver, scholarship. The ST/SC/OBC/Minority

cells acquaint the students about different government scheme particular to these group. The Cells also conduct programme on personality development to bring these category students into main stream. As the students are from very poor background, they have to face many challenges to fulfill their dream. The College has initiated a programme called Dig-Darshan in which eminent personalities who have broken the glass ceiling are invited for motivational talks.

Samaguri College maintains friendly relations with the students and alumni. Members of alumni Come to College on important occasions and cooperate in every activities organized by the institutions. Samaguri College has systematic mentoring mechanism by which 20 to 25 students are mentored by each faculty. Mentor teacher record the attendance, progress, participation of mentees in activities and establish friendly relation.

Most of the students of Samaguri College are first generation learners and the students have contributed to bring change in the area. The most positive impact of the change can be seen in the declining gender gap in case of pursuence of higher education. The students of the institutions are belonging to religious minority and tribal community and are from very conservative and orthodox families. The institutions has ensured safe environment for female students. The Anti-ragging Cell, Grievance Redressed Cell, Anti-Sexual Harassment, Counseling Cell of the college are very active and conduct awareness programme on gender equality in time to time. Till now there is no report of grievance, sexual harassment, ragging, or undesired behavior in the college. The effort to create positive environment in the college as well as in the society is reflected in the gradual increase of female students number which is evident in the following table.

The uniqueness of the institution is that the numbers of female students are increasing gradually which is very beneficial for the institution and for the society.

Samaguri College is a rural College and has the responsibility for providing education without any discrimination between male and female. The society is still in the grip of superstitions and religious orthodoxy. Women education is neglected in such rural areas. Teachers of this institution have been trying to motivate and create consciousness among the people about the importance of women education. **Teachers visit the villages and surrounding areas of the college, request the guardians to give opportunity to continue their married girls to pursue studies after marriage. Motivating such students to continue their educational journey even after marriage in such rural society is a special distinctiveness of the institution. As a result every year the institution has got 20 to 25 percent married girls' students pursuing higher education.**

5. CONCLUSION

Additional Information :

Samaguri College was established in 1990 under the initiative of some educationists and social activists with the full support of the community. The College is the only institution of higher education in Samaguri constituency. The College was provincialized in 2013 after 23 years of its establishment. Till then the teachers and non teaching staff served with minimum honorarium or can be said without payment. In 2013, the teachers who joined before 1998 bacome entitled to get the government salary, thereby only 11 teachers were included in the list. Only from 2021, the teachers are getting salary; however, eight numbers of teachers are still in tutors position and 3 posts including librarians post yet to be sanctioned.

In spite of many difficulties, the College is functioning well and able to produce a good number of graduate students every year. The students are first generation learners. Most of the students belong to minority and tribal communities, poor and underprivileged section. The institution gives admission to all regardless of their HSSLC percentage and gives them the opportunity to pursue higher education. Students of Samaguri College are humble, polite and gentle. Till now no incident of ragging, sexual harassment and undesired activities reported.

Many times the college fund deficiency has been met by the contribution of the college staff and local community. Department activities are carried out by the contribution of the faculties of the department. Even for the NAAC assessment the required fee is the contribution of the teaching and non-teaching staff of the College.

The College has been organizing National seminars, workshops, and webinars from time to time. The faculties have contribution in research publication in UGC referred journal. Mr. Dewajit Bora, HoD of Geography department awarded Best Paper Certificate for his research paper in 2016. Besides these the staffs of Samaguri College also shouldered social responsibilities. They perform duties in NRC preparation, Gunotsav, Election (Assembly and panchyat), Census, as Invigilators in various state level examination as and when required.

Concluding Remarks :

Samaguri College is one of the premier higher educational institutions of Nagaon district, Assam. Samaguri College is an Arts College, affiliated to Gauhati University. The college was established by the local community with an aim to spread higher education and to ensure all round development in the greater Samaguri area. The college team, from the establishment of the institution, has been trying their best to fulfill the aim.

The college is, at present, on the way of a gradual development. It has yet many problems to overcome to reach the goals. More than 80% students of the institution are first generation learners belonging to the marginalized groups. Wastage and stagnation are two major problems faced by the institution caused due to poor socioeconomic backgrounds of the marginalized groups. The institution is still lagging behind in infrastructure. Amidst all of the challenges, all possible means has been utilizing to spread higher education, to ensure quality education and to achieve academic excellence at the institutional level. All the stakeholders have been working together to solve those problems. Teachers are not only teaching the syllabus, but guiding and mentoring their disciples for a better future .The teachers take special care of their disciples to make them good human being with a good result to cope up with the changing society. As an outcome, the students of the college are going to be able to make better results as compared to the results of the previous examinations.

Samaguri College always tries to reach the unreached. Administration along with the teaching staff has been ceaselessly working for the upliftment of all the students irrespective of their social status, caste, creed and gender from its very inception. Consequently, they have been gaining confidence to face the challenges and marching forward to promote liberty, equality and fraternity in the society. This is the most significant contribution made by the Samaguri College to the society.
